Deposit: Increased Deposit Due to Previous FOIA Fees Not Paid In Full After a township has granted and fulfilled a written request from an individual under this act, if the township has not been paid in full the total amount of fees for the copies of public records that the township made available to the individual as a result of that written request, the township may require an increased estimated fee deposit of up to 100% of the estimated fee before it begins a full public record search for any subsequent written request from that individual if ALL of the following apply: (a) The final fee for the prior written request was not more than 105% of the estimated fee.
